

A wander around the pubs, past and present, of North Warnborough and Odiham

The route is very straightforward and shown on the map on the final page. Look out for the pubs or their former sites using the photos as you go - they are in order! Where possible there is an up to date photo of the pub or where it stood plus the oldest photo that could be found to provide a peek into history.

Part 1: North Warnborough to The Bury

Begin at the The Mill House and wander towards towards North Warnborough centre, turning right onto North Warnborough Street. (Four pubs or sites).

The Mill House became a restaurant in the early 1990's



The Jolly Miller at the end of Castlebridge Cottages was rebuilt in 1908



Castle Cottages

The Cat was a beer house leased from 1875 and closed in 1908



The Swan first licenced in 1789 closed in 2010



Continue along North Warnborough Street and then left along West Street. Detour left to the Chalk Pit before returning to walk down the path to the Bury. (Nine pub sites).

North Warnborough High Street

The Compasses was a beer house from late 19th century until 1920



The Jolly Farmer a beer house opened in 1847 and closed in 1908. It was situated in the Old Post Office and Laurel Cottage.



The Anchor formerly The Hope and Anchor in the mid 19th Century



West Street

Gardeners Arms (Now Albany and Whitsbury Cottages) from mid 19th century until 1920



Chalk Pit and The Bury

The Crown dates from 1736. This pub was then used as a Bangladeshi restaurant which closed in September 2014.



The Sign of The Castle was an alehouse in the mid 18th Century



The Bell Inn was a pub in the 17th Century and still is!



Black Horse 1740-1754

Situated in the Bury exact location unknown

The Chequers situated near the church 1752
